OLIVER!

September is a busy time for the society - not least as it is the month in which we will be casting OLIVER!

PRODUCTION DATES

The committee, in its analysis of the outcome from the last show, considered whether May was the best month for future productions. Following a meeting with the Regent Centre, we are hoping to get a booking for OLIVER! for 18th - 21st April 2012. Currently the dates are held by someone who is currently abroad. If they won't release it the dates will be 16th - 19th May. I will let everyone know as soon as we know!

We also have a preliminary date of 17th - 20th April 2013 for RAGTIME. Both of these dates puts them within the school Easter holidays which makes it easier for our younger performers. This does shorten the rehearsal period, but in the case of OLIVER! I do not see this as too much of a problem as the work is known to us all. As to RAGTIME - well we did TITANIC in April - so I am confident we can still fit it all in.

AUDITION PROCESS

The audition pieces are detailed in the panel on page 4 and the numbers relate to the libs and vocal parts we will be using (see next page for more detail).

As obligated in our constitution, there will be adverts in the New Milton Advertiser for all auditions of which there are three main events as detailed here:

**WEDNESDAY 7th at BARTON -
INTRODUCTORY EVENING—
7.30pm**

This starts the process with video clips to set the scene and enjoy some highlights. We will look at the scope of the show, the characters and style. After coffee we will all learn 'Consider Yourself' which will be the chorus audition piece. I will want everyone who is auditioning to complete a form providing their details and noting the parts for which they want to audition. From this I will construct an audition schedule. This will be emailed to all.

SUNDAY 11th at SOPLEY - ADULT CASTING - 10.00am - 4.00pm

The usual procedure, with a schedule to save people having to hang around. At the scheduled time, all those casting for a particular part will be taught the song, learn any dance steps, and read through the dialogue. Once this has been done, all will retire to another room and will then be seen individually by the casting committee. People not casting can remain to act as an audience. The results of these auditions will be notified by individual offer letters. This will offer the part on the basis that all planned absences are notified before rehearsals; that the Production Fee of £15, and membership fees are fully paid before the start of rehearsals on December 7th.

SUNDAY 25th at SOPLEY - Kids Auditions - 10.00am - 4.00pm

We will audition both boys and girls aged 10 years by the date of the performance. Existing child members are exempt from this rule. It will be a long day for some and food, drink and quiet entertainment should be brought along.

Parents/guardians and children will be invited to meet at 10.00am for an introductory talk to explain the scope of the show and the responsibility of

the parents with regard to rehearsals and safeguarding. An introductory sheet detailing all of this will be provided. All children will complete a details form and allocated a number which they will wear on a badge.

All children will be taught 'Consider Yourself' together with associated dance steps. Following this the children will go to another room and then be called in groups of 4 or 5 to perform for the casting committee with parents still present.

Following an initial assessment, some will be told that they have not been selected and they can leave. The remainder will then be asked to audition again to get down to a manageable number. The casting committee will then decide on those who will be Workhouse Children and Fagin's Gang.

Those who want to continue to audition for Oliver and Artful Dodger will be asked to remain and the remainder will then leave.

The process of learning and performing will continue until there is a successful outcome. The results of these auditions will be notified by individual offer letters, offering the part on the basis that all planned absences are notified before rehearsals; that the Production Fee of £15, and membership fees (£15) are fully paid before the start of rehearsals on December 7th.

CHORUS AUDITIONS

We will be asking everyone who wants to be in the chorus to audition, in particular so that the choreographer has a good idea how she can use everyone. This will be done at a scheduled time on Sunday 11th and on Sunday

PROFESSIONAL SHOW IN SOUTHAMPTON

At the time of choosing OLIVER!, the committee was aware that for all of May, the Mayflower will be staging a professional show. Their view was that the associated publicity would work to our favour and that local people would rather see the show locally. Certainly they might well get confused where it is on and opt for the local venue. We know of instances where there have been other professional shows on at the same time as a local amateur ver-

sion, and box office was not affected.

SOME FURTHER THOUGHTS

There will only be one troupe of children. I am of the view, that however you manage it you end up with one good troupe and one not so good. I want to give our audiences a consistent product.

Dog or no Dog? The previous three times I directed this show I did not use a dog (Bullseye). There are considerable problems to do with using live animals both in terms of licensing and insurance. My view has always been that it adds little to the story. However, if any member has a suitable dog, or knows someone with one, then I am happy to think again!

The chance to see a profes-

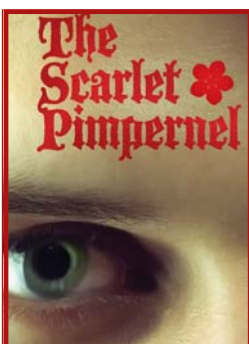
